1. Approval of the Minutes of the September 11, 2012 Transportation Technical Committee Meeting. Mr. Kammler chaired the meeting in Mr. Burgstrum's absence. Mr. Kammler asked for a motion to approve the September 11, 2012 minutes as written. Mr. Hinton motioned to approve, and Mr. Wilson seconded the motion. Hearing no comments and/or corrections, the motioned carried.
2. Project Progress Report. Mr. Melton reported that the Kennedy Drive reconstruction project from 17th Avenue to Avenue of the Cities was 50% complete. Mr. Melton stated that the maintenance project on I-74 over IL 5 had been completed. He also reported that the Davenport Credit Island Bridge project had been completed. No action was needed from the Technical Committee.
3. Discussion of Market Packages and Best Practices Examples for the Bi-State Regional Intelligent Transportation System Architecture (ITS) update. Mr. Patel presented on the service

packages and benefits of using the National ITS Architecture in the Bi-State Region. Examples of service packages are as follows:

- Traffic Incident Management System
- Broadcast Traveler Information
- Surface Street Control
- Transit Vehicle Tracking

Benefits would be better communication between stakeholders, reduced design costs and development time, and orderly, efficient, and better communication between systems. Mr. Kammler asked what packages Bi-State would recommend and for which projects would each package be best used. Ms. McCullough stated that Bi-State staff would go through the 96 service packages and community data reports and create a matrix of existing and proposed service packages recommended in the region.

4. Report on Trail Counting Opportunities in the Bi-State Region. Mr. Olson presented on TRAFx Trail Counters and how to use the TraFx DataNet site. He stated that Bi-State has 12 counters in total to provide trail counting technical assistance to communities. Trail counters have been tested both at the Rock Island County building and at Schwiebert Park. They are ready for data collection projects. Interested communities can contact either Doug DeLille or Geoff Olson to schedule a trail study.
5. Public Comments. No comments from the public were received at the meeting.
6. Other Business. A call for Surface Transportation Program (STP) projects was mailed October 5, 2012. The due date for projects is November 2, 2012. Projects will be presented in December.
7. Adjournment. The meeting was adjourned by consensus at 11:15 a.m.
