1. Approval of Minutes of the February 8, 2022 Transportation Technical Committee (TTC) Meeting. Mr. Kammler requested a motion for approval of the February 8, 2022 minutes of the Transportation Technical Committee. Ms. Kersten motioned to approve the minutes as written. Mr. Massa seconded, and the motion carried. There was not a quorum in the room, and actions taken at the March 8 meeting will need to be ratified at the April meeting.
2. Status of Project Progress Report. Mr. Vasquez thanked committee members for sending updates and edits in the past month. A new report was sent out with the February meeting packet. Mr. Vasquez asked committee members to keep sending in updates as project status changes. Mr. Vasquez facilitated a verbal project reporting this month. The group went down the project list and each entity was given an opportunity to discuss their respective projects. Updated progress reports are posted to the Bi-State website.
3. Status on the Congestion Management Process Plan Update. Mr. Vasquez presented an update on the Congestion Management Plan (CMP). He listed the goals and objectives and of the plan, and discussed the various resources and data sources used in the update of the CMP. He noted he would be conducting some internal coordination over

the next week to keep the update moving along. The plan is set to be completed in CY2022, and Mr. Vasquez noted the final draft is expected be presented in May.

4. Status Report on Road and Bridge Construction Mapping Project. Mr. Vasquez reported the status of the Road and Bridge Construction Interactive Mapping Project. Bi-State is currently reaching out to peer GIS contacts to get an idea of the structure of their GIS data in order to build a map interface that will work with the various datasets. IL DOT and IA DOT both have interactive construction maps, as well as some of Bi-State's peers, so the thought is to structure all the data in a manner in which it can be utilized by member governments once the platform is up and running. He noted this would streamline the project once it is active because this would lessen the work for Bi-State and its member governments. The project is expected to be completed in CY2022
5. Status Report on Intelligent Transportation System (ITS) Architecture Update. Mr. Wu reviewed the Regional ITS Reference Architecture, from legislation requirements to the latest layout of ARC-IT (Architecture Reference for Cooperative and Intelligent Transportation) and RAD-IT (Regional Architecture Development for Intelligent Transportation), as well as the information gathering process that is underway from all stakeholders in the QC region.

Mr. Wu requested the ITS Inventory survey to be filled out by our stakeholders and returned in the next week to 10 days. It will be followed by one additional survey: the ITS Services survey. Bi-State is planning on develop this regional ITS architecture in the next few months, with a goal of producing a draft plan by the end of June.

6. Public Comments. There were no public comments.
7. Other Business: The following dates were noted from the agenda for reference. Ms. McCullough highlighted the two grant deadlines. Mr. DeLille noted a webinar set for March 16 at 10:00 a.m. on the SPR grant program. It was noted that the Iowa DOT is soliciting comments on the state's Long Range Transportation Plan and Freight Plan.
